



### A Tribute to Talented Trainers

I first met Paul and Peggy Dorion when I started attending field trials just for the good company and camping experience. I didn't know much about running dogs - I didn't even own a pointing dog. But I loved riding, so chasing dogs through the desert on horseback sounded like a lot of fun to me! I tagged along with Bill and Cindy Leffingwell and in doing so, met a fabulous group of people who have become an integral part of my life.

Bill and Cindy bred their field champion Redlines Teguila Smoker "Smokey" to their bitch Redlines Till Tomorrow "Tilly" in 2005, and after all the pups went home, all that was left was a rolypoly male nicknamed Smokey Link because he was so ROUND! Cindy asked me if I wanted him, and although hesitant at first, I figured, "What the heck. This way I'll have something of my own to chase around the desert." So. Redline's Smokin' Gun "Colt" came home and I promptly began making every mistake in the book: I let him run free at the ranch; I let him eat too much; I let him sleep in bed with me...you name it, I did it - WRONG!

Thank goodness that Paul and Peggy agreed to take Colt into their training program in June 2006 after I somehow successfully earned him his Open Puppy and Open Derby points. The first thing Paul said to me when I talked to him was, "Did you ever discipline this dog?" "Nope," I replied, "I left that for you to do!"

His first time on the ground after spending just three months under Paul's tutelage, Colt took a first in Open Gun Dog and won a 5 point major! No one could believe that the same roly-poly puppy who had no discipline accomplished such a feat, but that is what is so wonderful about Paul and Peggy. They somehow manage to bring out the best in so many of the dogs that they

train. Time after time, I've heard people say how it was Paul who force broke their dog, or it was Paul who handled their dog to their field championship. If a dog has any potential talent as a hunting dog or field trialing dog, Paul knows how to bring it out.

Paul is an exemplary trainer; he has an incredible work ethic and works or



roads all of the dogs on his line almost daily. Owners never doubt that they are getting their money's worth when they see the shape their dogs are in after spending just a couple of months with Paul. He is passionate about what he does for a living and it is amazing to watch how all the dogs on his line snap to attention when he comes out of his trailer, especially if they have been barking at a stranger going by! And Peggy Dorian is the field trialing scout extraordinaire; she can charge up a hill and locate a dog faster than anyone I know, and together they rarely lose a dog because of Peggy's incredible talent for keeping track of them on the field.

Remember that roly-poly puppy that I spoiled? It broke my heart when I sent him off to training. All I did was think about him sitting in a cold kennel without the comfort of his mom and dad in

bed with him at night. Then my fears were put to rest. The first time I was allowed to visit him, Colt was all excited to see me UNTIL Paul showed up; then it was "Sheri who?" Obviously, it isn't all about discipline at Paul and Peggy's Place. These dogs love Paul and they do a special brand of spoiling too - don't forget the cookie every night at bedtime!

This year, Paul and Peggy had over 24 dogs in training. Typical of every field trialing season, Paul and Peggy ran a dog in almost every Open Puppy, Open Derby, Gun Dog and All Age stake. They were in the saddle from dawn until dusk and never faltered in providing the same time and attention to each and every dog. That is what impresses me so much about these two - their sportsmanship and style are legendary! Together, they have earned dozens of dogs their field championships. This year alone, Paul finished several dogs including that roly-poly puppy who had long since blossomed into a sleek, muscled, big running, gun dog! It still amazes me to think of what Paul accomplished with Colt in just one season. He is now a field champion and if all goes well in the next few months, he will earn his show points and become another Dual Brittany.

I want to take this time to publicly thank Paul and Peggy for their continued hard work and dedication to the Brittany world. They have taken many young inexperienced pups and finished them into world class champions. Their humble spirits and good sportsmanship go without saying. If there was a Handler/Trainer Award in the AKC, I would certainly nominate them for it! But Paul and Peggy probably wouldn't get that excited about it - as we in the CBC know, they are in this for the dogs and not for all the flash and glory. That's what makes them so special.
