PERFORMANCE BRITTANYS

Our good friend Nero has tried a whole new sport! Matt and Stephanie took him to a Trailing and Locating event sponsored by NASDA and had an exciting time. Unlike scent work trials, in which the dog searches a designated area for a "hide" consisting of a q-tip size article scented with birch, anise, clove, or cypress oil, which may be in a container, buried in a tub, or hidden anywhere in an interior or exterior, this new sport involves a live target, generally a rat. A trail is laid, which the dog follows to find a live rat (in a cage) within the allowable time. This differs from a barn hunt, where there is a live rat, but no scent trail.

Anyway, Nero made a total of six runs, earning his TL1 title and is only two points away from his UL1 (urban locating) title. In the process he won first place and high in class in two runs as well as two seconds and a third. Way to go Nero!

Meanwhile Rowan is on a sort of sabbatical leave from scent work competition while we try to recalibrate her searches. It seems that she has decided the possibility of finding live prey in the surrounding environment is more enticing than locating more oilscented hides in the designated areas. With the guidance of two terrific trainer/competitors, I'm trying to get her engaged in fun games every time she comes

out of the car or crate wearing her harness, leading to simple searches once she is focusing well. Only after a successful alert on a hide does she earn a wonderful treat that she never gets any other time. If you have ever smelled buffalo lung steaks, you have to wonder, as I do, why anyone would think it's worth eating, but Rowan says they are delicious!

We are on the waiting list for a small trial at the end of December, and entered in another big trial in early January, so we'll see if this new patterning does the trick. Meanwhile, Happy Holidays to everyone! I'm sure there are some Brittanys out there competing in Rally, Obedience, Agility, and other sports, but we need to hear from them!
